The applicants need to show a distinct interest and passion to work in an interdisciplinary/transdisciplinary collaborative environment and have a strong background in one or more of the Humanities disciplines (Arts, History, Literature, Anthropology, History, Sociology or Architecture) and/or related human geography and geographic information science disciplines, with some computational skills. Applicants should have strong research and writing skills. Published already would be an advantage.

Candidates should have a combination of social sciences, education, built environment and community development expertise.

Ideally, applicants should be familiar with one or more below,

- Interest and/or understanding of curriculum design, reform and transformation
- Interest and/or understanding of spatial humanities

• Interest and/or understanding of praxis led education and/or activist scholarship in context of curriculum transformation

While the exact portfolio will be communicated, applicants are expected;

- To be robustly involved in specific areas and aspects of the Project,
- To offer a termly seminar based on their work
- To engage with a cohort of Masters/Doctoral students
- To research and publish in in the area of Spatial Humanities

More specifically, key responsibilities of the Post-Doctoral fellow include:

- Contributing to the sustainable growth of the research programme portfolio;
- Publishing scholarly journal articles, book chapters, policy and research briefs;
- Assisting with proposals and grant applications to undertake funded research;
- Assisting in mentoring interns and research assistants;

REQUIREMENTS

- Certified copies of the MA/PhD Degrees
- A recent curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Letter of motivation indicating suitability for position & your understanding of Spatial Humanities
- Example of authored academic work if available

The monthly salary is R 15 000 and there is additionally a travel grant of R 20 000 to facilitate conference travel.

All relocation travel costs are at own expense of successful applicant. The position does not include accommodation which is to be met with the stipend.
