#### Our vantage/philosophy

- This community deserves a world class event
  - If Esri can draw 15,000, FOSS4G should be able to continue to grow
    - To an expensive location in the Summer



- People will come, and pay for a great conference in a desirable location
- Revenues from successful Global conference can support strong regional confs
  - Particularly in the developing world
- It is important to grow the community and to more broadly expose the maturity of the ecosystem
  - Program with strong technical content, as well as **use case**, **business** & **lessons learned** content

#### **Registration is strong**

>1,100 attendees

#### Finances are strong

- Will definitely pay back advance in full
- Anticipating a surplus of >\$50,000
- Overall budget >\$900,000
- Overall revenue >\$1,000,000
- Sponsor revenue >25% of revenue

#### **Affordability**

- Aggressive early bird (\$650 for 3 days,
  6 meals)
- 60 volunteer passes
- "Earned" passes for workshop instructors
- Travel grant program
- Scarcity of large venues drives up cost for big confs

#### **Lessons learned and observations**

- Strong professional conference organizer partner is crucial
- Full-time "operations coordinator" was crucial, and affordable working from Mar-Aug
- The requirement to video everything adds a great deal of cost and complexity for the LOC
- There is room for conference date to move between Aug - Oct
  - No time is perfect for everyone
  - People showed up in August
  - Costs can vary greatly between the months
