Global FOSS4G 2025

- The Auckland Local Organising Committee (LOC) has submitted a request to endorse their proposal for hosting the global FOSS4G 2025 in Auckland. Find it <u>here</u>. The proposal is due on Monday 15th so we need to decide whether we endorse.
- Alex is reminded he's declared a conflict of interest, asked if he should excuse himself from this discussion as his participation may influence the outcome. After inputs from the chair, Alex decides to stay but not participate in the discussion.
- John is asked to share his perspective, and takes a few minutes to lay it out:
 - very impressive proposal! well done to the LOC.
 - \circ context

- we're asked to guarantee a budget much larger than our bank balance
- conference surplus is bulk of OSGeo Oceania and OSGeo budgets, determines future Oceania & global community investment
- outlook for FOSS4G 2025 is unknown, we've heard a range of perspectives
 - mostly from the LOC, understandably optimistic
 - last night Ewen started a <u>list of risks</u> but we haven't discussed them
 - Cameron Shorter (chair of FOSS4G Sydney 2009)
 - we have the ability to do it
 - FOSS4G 2009 barely broke even at the last minute
 - suggests to plan for the size of FOSS4G Oceania plus ~20% (ie 175-300 people)
- my break even analysis: based on LOC budgets, considering fixed vs variable per-person costs: if nothing goes wrong, break even is ~230 total attendance; if we take cost of TGP into account, it's ~290
- useful to consider Auckland 2023, results were below expectations:
 - forecast 100-400 attendees, actual 143, paid 99 at low end of projections
 - forecast 28-64k surplus actual 10k
- OO's current position
 - FY 2023-2024 expecting a large loss ~\$12k (excl early Hobart expenses)
 - Hobart outcome may improve next year's position but too early to know
 - need to resolve 2023 GST issue with IRD
- summary
 - impact of loss/low surplus would be large globally and regionally, we could even go bankrupt
 - uncertainty budget may be too optimistic re: attendees
 - our financial & regulatory positions are uncertain
 - given uncertainty and our position, I don't think we should place this bet
 - we shouldn't count on being bailed out if things go wrong; perhaps OSGeo could be the financial backer?
- Others share their concerns and perspectives:
 - \circ $\;$ travel may be difficult post-COVID, travel budgets have been cut
 - o concerns about costs, particularly the dinner
 - cost of travel to NZ may increase
 - Pacific economies are struggling people may not be able to attend
 - will depend on how we do in Hobart but we don't know yet
 - opportunity cost what will we have to give up to do this?
- Alex points out we have a risk register to review and mitigate risks
- Asked if we could do a remote dial-in option for the conference for people who can't make it in person. Alex says it's plausible.
- Positive sentiments:
 - community spirit
 - May result in an increase in movement to local conferences
- Q: Possible to ask OSGeo to be the backer instead of OO? Alex: risk of losing money is basically zero, the bigger risk is that we split the community and upset those who have worked on this.

- Q: How would the community be split? Alex: If OO chooses not to support, the LOC would have to find support elsewhere, so OO would not participate.
- Some discussion about whether providing "fiscal sponsorship" and seed money means we're financially liable. Not totally clear. Alex provided a definition of fiscal sponsorship, one definition is *"Fiscal sponsorship refers to the practice of non-profit organizations offering their legal and tax-exempt status to groups—typically projects—engaged in activities related to the sponsoring organization's mission. It typically involves a fee-based contractual arrangement between a project and an established non-profit."*
- Due to time, we need to decide.
- Motion 1: The board commits to providing fiscal sponsorship for the local organising committee for FOSS4G 2025, including accepting financial liability and a commitment to seed funding. Alex moves, Jonah seconds.
 - Alex abstains
 - Eli, Jonah, Dorothy, Ewen, Alan in favour.
 - Raf and John not in favour.
- Motion 2: The board endorses the proposal and budget to be submitted to OSGeo. Eli moves, Jonah seconds.
 - Alex abstains
 - Eli, Dorothy, Jonah, Alan, Ewen in favour
 - Raf and John not in favour.
- Motion 3: The board commits to providing \$25 k NZD in seed funding to the LOC
 - Motion not required due to motion 1 succeeding.
- Motion 4: The board will not commit TGP funding now, but will reconsider at a later date. Eli moves, Dorothy seconds.
 - Alex abstains
 - All others in favour

FOSS4G SotM Oceania 2024

- TGP budget review following OSGeo decision not to sponsor it
 - context: we asked OSGeo for AUD \$5k but their annual TGP budget is already exhausted
 - there hasn't been any decision on OO TGP budget need to move on this quickly to provide clarity
- Other updates from Alex:
 - We have one registration!
 - \circ $\;$ We have ~6 logo competition entries, and that closes today
 - It's time to start contacting sponsors directly
 - Met with UTAS and had a great conversation with a couple of geospatial lecturers/leaders there. They are happy to help us seek student volunteers.

Other business

• NZ GST: Greg didn't have a chance to visit the IRD office. He has sent them a message regarding GST registration - we are waiting to hear back. We've asked him to make Elisa the authorised person on the IRD account so we can access it directly.
