Hosting FOSS4G 2016 in Dublin provides exciting opportunities to promote OSGeo and FOSS4G in Ireland but also to use the conference as a means of further diffusion of OSGeo and FOSS4G to other countries. We shall be developing and strengthening Ireland's participation in the UK OSGeo Local Chapter.

What is the experience of your committee members with similar events?

Our core LOC (and additional LOC members) have very considerable experience organizing and managing conference events in Europe and globally. This includes AGILE, GeoComputation, ACM-GIS, GIS-RUK and FOSS4G Europe 2015. The LOC have been involved in the organization of hundreds of smaller scientific workshops (e.g. EU COST Actions & European Research Council), symposiums, meetings & training courses. To ensure FOSS4G 2016 is run proficiently and efficiently we will engage the services of a professional conference organizer (PCO) with Dublin Convention Bureau. Our PCO has excellent local knowledge and appropriate experience for organizing events with over 1,000 delegates.

What is your venue? (include access to Internet, room sizes, max attendees)

Our chosen venue is the iconic <u>Convention Centre</u>, <u>Dublin</u> (<u>The CCD</u>). The CCD is <u>superbly located</u> in Ireland's capital city and is located just 20 minutes from Dublin Airport. This dedicated, purpose built venue has hosted over 1,000 events since opening in 2010 including conferences with up to 4,500 delegates. The CCD includes a 2,000 seat auditorium, 22 multi-functional, flexible rooms, generous exhibition space, conference and banqueting halls, dining and coffee facilities with ample meeting rooms and breakout spaces. It is one of the finest such venues internationally. The CCD's free WiFi can serve up to 12,000 simultaneous connections. The CCD will provide

professional on-site technical event support during the conference.

What is the price range and general location of your proposed accommodations?

Dublin offers over 18,500 competitively priced bedrooms. Options are available in all price ranges within 10km of The CCD. Over 6,000 bedrooms are within walking distance of The CCD including a variety of international hotel chains, boutique hotels, hostels and B&Bs. Sample pricing includes: The Marker, a 5 star hotel, costs approximately €260 single B&B while Jurys, a 3 star hotel, costs approximately €150 B&B single for 2016. Hostel accommodation is available at approximately €20 - €60 B&B. In addition to easy access to the CCD by walking and free city bicycles excellent bus and tram connections to the CCD make travel from accommodation in the city very efficient.

Are you partnering with other local organizations?

Structural Support Partners: We have secured support from throughout Ireland to host FOSS4G in Ireland in 2016 including from our universities and research centres, our National Tourism Development Authority - Fáilte Ireland, Dublin Convention Bureau and The CCD. ICT & Knowledge Partners: Dublin is European headquarters for many major ICT, financial, manufacturing and pharmaceutical companies.
